Sharing Cultures Context

- Sharing Cultures an international, intercultural, multilingual, online reading and writing, collaborative adventure
- Hospitality as a metaphor for this type of project



Computer mediated communication

- Platform for intense social activity
- Writing is a social act
- · Audience, purpose and ethos shift
- Writing in CMC's not about argument or good grammar: encouraging readers to keep reading, generating as much response as possible
- Type of writing not harmful to students
- Discourses students use provide us with deeper understanding of how they write, chat and play



CMC's

- Ludic discourses- cyberword used to describe online writing (ludicrous)
- Serio-ludic discourses-engage in serious discussion
- Our purpose: to analyze postings to view how students initiate and sustain discussion using ludic and serio-ludic discourses



Homo Ludens as an analytic lens

Play as cultural phenomenon

"Play is significant; always present in culture Involves fun; characteristic includes its freedom; lies outside of real life; secluded and limited in time; represents something; reality is accessed by playing with it"

(Huizinga, 1970)



Review of literature

- Reference to ludic and play have appeared in CMC studies (Daisley 1995, Hawisher 1992)
- Daisley: play and pleasure aspects were productive for practice of literacy
- Rouzie (2001) ludic, play integrated aspect of human nature and dialogic practices
- Holcomb (1997) joking powerful way of creating online sense of community
- Rouzie (2001) provoke and mediate conflict, negotiate power relations



International context

- Two important studies:
- Basharina (2007) Project between three countries students preferred chatting off discussion board because formal essayistic writing not much fun
- Warner(2004) noted three types of play:
 Language
 - Identity
 - Frame
 - Deserved attention of applied linguists
 - Ludic discourses as a rhetorical and social act that is central to how we talk and write to one another



Researching Student Writing

- Introductions and Ludic discourse
 - play as a means of establishing connections
 - Play with identity
 - Play with language
 - Play with frame
- Cross-cultural negotiation through humor

Lenses and filters

- Huizinga (1971) refers to the above aspect of play as contest or jousting.
- Goes beyond responding and takes on a dimension of battle
- Use sophisticated language and structuring to achieve this sequence and to sustain it



Researching Student Writing

- From Connection to Deeper Discussions
- Serio-ludic discourses: used to critique and negotiate power..
 - Negotiation of "taboo" or difficult topics
 - gay marriage
 - 9/11 conspiracy theories
 - Religion
 - Zuma rape trial
 - Iraq War
 - HIV/Aids



Deeper discussions (Opening Gambit)

Deeper discussion (Counterattack)

- "American Conspiracies ♦? On the Global Issues section of the Drupal web site I came upon this post by a South African named xxxxx, titled America to Take Over the World. This is what this person wrote on 03-29-2006.
- I personally love conspiracy theories because half the time they make absolutely no sense. The one I love the most is one of the comments to America to Take Over the World, posted that it says that the government blew up the World Trade Center, because it is impossible for a Boeing 737 to create the damage to brough the towers down. Believe me when I say this it is very, very possible for a plane to create the damage that brought them down; all you have to do is study the construction of the buildings and the circumstances of the day.



Lenses and filters 2

- Initiation of sensitive topic 9/11
- Makes indirect proposition " it has been.."
- Respondent engages in equally unemotional way. Huizinga (1971) refers to this as playing and knowing; competition for superiority is always play. This includes contests of knowing



What it all means

- Writing classes have much to gain by using CMC's purposefully
- Recognize shift in pedagogy regarding use of technology, and role of play as a social cultural activity
- Huizinga's (1971) homo ludens provides a useful lens through which to view play, writing activity and development



So what has this to do with writing?

- Read and write quantitatively more
- Audience awareness: SSW (2008) awareness of audience statistically significant predictor of writing development
- Engage in academic writing strategies through dialogic community building practices
 - Connecting to audience
 - Engaging with and responding to,
 - Building on the ideas posited by others



But students sum it up best..

- "..my lecturer will kill me if she sees the slang I used in this posting.." (XXX:2006)
- ..."So your professor wants you to conduct these blogs in a formal manner...Why is that, doesn't he/she know that when people are formal they hide their true selves.." (XXXXX: 2006)
