### Academic orientations 2008

- Academic orientations implemented in two faculties during 2008
- New cooperative partnerships
- Involvement commenced two weeks before official classes started
- Three to five hours per session
- Interventions during first semester





#### Support from the Deans

- ADU and faculty representative
- Plan orientation sessions
- Use actual academic material where possible
- Try to create a "real life" experience
- Integrated effort between ADU and Faculty
- Logistics surrounding session
- Student opinion
- Research on effectiveness
