HOW TO NAVIGATE IN ACROBAT READER

1. Maximise the size of the window:

- Click the maximise button in the title bar, top right.
- If it is open, hide the navigation plane on the left by clicking <a>[III] on the toolbar.

2. Choose an appropriate magnification:

- Select the zoom-in tool the page (several times), or
- Select the magnification button in the status bar at the bottom or on the menu. Choose View and select a magnification level, preferably "Fit Width" or "Actual Size", or
- Experiment by clicking on D In the toolbar.
 Experiment with Full Screen in View Full Screen.

3. How to browse within a document:

- Of course, as in Windows, you can scroll with the vertical scroll bar or the keyboard
 UP and DOWN arrows.
- With the hand-tool (?) engaged, if you click and hold the left mouse button, you can *drag* the page up and down, depending on the level of magnification.
- PAGE DOWN and PAGE UP on the keyboard give you half a page scrolling.
- But you can turn the pages as in a traditional book! You can jump from page to page using the
 PREVIOUS/NEXT page buttons.
- It hakes you to the first page or last page, as does CTRL HOME and CTRL END on the keyboard.
- takes you to the previous view, which can be the previous document if you jumped documents. You can always return to your original location by clicking several times.
