## **Admission requirements and selection criteria**

Anyone who has a three-year Baccalaureus degree or any other qualification which is approved and considered appropriate by the Senate, may be accepted for the MPhil degree. Depending on the study background and experience of the applicant, supplementary work may be suggested as a prerequisite before the person is allowed to register for this degree. Although basic music knowledge is a prerequisite for admission to the MPhil degree, it may be possible to accommodate students who do not comply with these prerequisites because of the modular structure of the course content.

### *Nature of the programme*

The programme is two years in length: advanced technological and research skills in music technology and multimedia areas are covered. A qualified individual will be able to apply and develop technology in a meaningful and responsible way.
